"It is a good thing to let prayer be the first business of the morning and the last at night.

(A Simple Way to Pray, 1535, LW 43:193)

Our VBS memory verse has had me thinking about how we might always remember God's presence in our daily lives. This has led to thoughts about praying unceasingly (1 Thessalonians 5) and meditating on God's word and day and night (Psalm 1). If we are to be strong and courageous and truly remember that God will be with us wherever we go, then praying unceasingly and meditating on God's word day and night.

Neither of these are easy feats, particularly in a world with so many distractions. Luther lived in a much different world than we do—there were no cellphones to distract him—but that doesn't mean he didn't understand how distracted we can be in prayer, which is why he suggested first thing in the morning and last thing at night. This way pray is before and after everything else that might distract us.

Luther's Morning and Evening Prayer

In the morning, as soon as you get out of bed.

In the evening when you go to bed.

you are to make the sign of the holy cross and say:

God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit watch over me.

Then, kneeling or standing, say the Apostles' Creed and the Lord's Prayer. If you wish, you may in addition recite this little prayer as well:

I give thanks to you, heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ your dear Son, that you have

protected me through the night from all harm and danger

graciously protected me today.

I ask

that you would also protect me today from sin and all evil, so that my life and actions may please you.

to forgive me all my sins, where I have done wrong, and graciously to protect me tonight.

Into your hands I commend myself: my body, my soul, and all that is mine. Let your holy angel be with me, so that the wicked foe may have no power over me. Amen.

After singing a hymn, or whatever else may serve your devotion, you are to go to your work joyfully.

Then you are to go to sleep quickly and cheerfully.

Luther wrote Morning and Evening prayers in the Small Catechism to guide people in how to pray at these times. These are beautiful prayers, that can still speak to us today. There is significant overlap in these prayers: the middle and right are the morning prayer, and the middle and left are the evening prayer, with the bold indication the additional overlap.

If you'd like a prayer card (or 2 or 3) of your own, you can find them in the back of the sanctuary.

May we become people who pray unceasingly as we lean on God's many promises for us.

Mission Endowment Fund Guidelines

Income from the Endowment Fund shall be distributed annually and at such other times as deemed necessary and/or feasible in support of the following:

- 1 Missions
- 2 Education
- 3 Special Ministries
- 4 Worship Life
- 5 Capital Projects
- A. Annually, a minimum of 20% of the dispersed income generated shall be used for outreach programs not directly implemented by St. Peter Lutheran Church.
- B. Annually, no more than 60% of the dispersed income shall be spent in any one category or on any one project.

Programs for support shall be recommended by the Endowment Fund Committee and approved by the Church Council. The program shall be voted on by the congregation according to the guidelines established by the congregation.

Disbursement of income from the Fund need not occur annually in the event causes and programs have not been approved by the Committee sufficient to utilize total income available or, if in the judgment of the Committee, total annual disbursement of income is not recommended.



June 14, 2023 7:00 PM Secretary's Report

NEO Synod Assembly Recap

I had the opportunity to represent St. Peter at the 2023 Northeast Ohio (NEO) Synod Assembly May 12-13 in Akron. On Friday evening, Pastor Stephanie and I joined 200 other voting members from the Synod's 164 churches for the annual event. (I was surprised to learn that some of the other Ohio Synod's only assemble every three years.)

On Friday night we enjoyed hearing from talented Bible storytellers and music by the praise band. Also on this evening Pastor Stephanie was elected to serve a three year term on the Synod Church Council as the Southwest-Rostered representative.

The Assembly reconvened on Saturday morning and additional elections were held. One contest ended in a tie and the subsequent run off was decided by only one vote!

There were two resolutions brought before the Assembly:

- 1. Care of Creation resolution which pertained to fossil fuels and climate change was referred back to the Synod Council.
- 2. Anti-Racism Resolution passed by a wide margin.

Other items of business included voting on changes to Governing Documents such as compensation standards and the approval of the 2024-2025 proposed budget. One point of concern in the proposed budget was a decrease in the support of Lutheran Outdoor Ministries (LOMO) from a funding level of \$40,000 in the original 2023-2024 budget to \$0.00 in the requested 2024-2025 budget. After amendments to amendments were made, the voting members passed the recommendation that LOMO funding be added back into the budget. Unfortunately, the proposed budget already showed a loss of -\$109,558.

Figures of note in the 2024-2025 budget:

Mission Support Income from the churches to the NEOS= \$1,225,000

(The % of giving from each church is listed in the proceedings. The range is 0-19% with St. Peter being in the 6-7% range.)

ELCA Churchwide Support from the NEOS= \$525,000

Total NEO Synod Staff Expenses = \$770,208

Anniversaries of interest included the recognition of the 175th anniversary of St. Paul, Smithville and the 55th anniversary of the ordination of Pastor John Wanamaker.

Attending the Assembly reminded me how blessed we are at St. Peter to have Pastor Stephanie in our midst and enjoy strong financial support. If you have not attended an Assembly previously, I would recommend considering it for next year. I always learn something new about the inner workings of the ELCA.
