Cause and effect is one of the more satisfying principles in our daily lives. You flip the light switch, and the light turns on. You flip it again, and the light turns off. You put brownie batter in a hot oven, and end up with brownies. You turn on the air conditioner, and the house cools down. The cause and effects are so automatic in our lives that when they don't work, we get frustrated, like when the power goes out, or the oven stops working, or (heaven forbid) we lose WIFI.

And we wish that our faith lives would work the same way. For example, we want to have strong faith and end up with a good (and easier) life. We want to pray and get the answer to prayer that we desire. And when that doesn't work, we can start to think that faith doesn't work. When we see God answer some prayers and not others, then we can start to think that something is wrong with us.

Nothing could be further from the truth. Christian life simply doesn't follow the normal patterns of cause and effect that we know and love. Again and again, we are drawn back to the old adage, "God is God and we are not," or even the biblical pronouncement that God's thoughts are not our thoughts, and God's ways are not our ways (Isaiah 55:8). It can seem unfair when someone else's prayer gets answers and ours doesn't. It can seem downright cruel when someone else gets the miracle we desperately want and need. Yet it doesn't make God any less good.

In Daniel 3, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego get thrown into the fiery furnace. Since we know the end of the story, we know that they get their miracle, but what is most amazing to me in their story, is their comments before they get in the furnace. King Nebuchadnezzar asks them to defend themselves, and they reply,

King Nebuchadnezzar, we do not need to defend ourselves before you in this matter. If we are thrown into the blazing furnace, the God we serve is able to deliver us from it, and he will deliver us from Your Majesty's hand. But even if he does not, we want you to know, Your Majesty, that we will not serve your gods or worship the image of gold you have set up. (Daniel 3:16-18)

It's the almost-passing comment, "but even if God does not," that sticks with me. Even if God doesn't save them, they will trust God; even if God doesn't rescue them, they will not abandon their faith. This is the challenge and the blessing of Christian faith.

I recently experienced something of a miracle myself. In response, someone shared with me that God can work in impossible situations, and I was in the perfect position to share this message, especially given the events in my life and my occupation. However, I could only think about the people that don't get the miracle, those who don't see the answer to prayer.

My prayer for all of you is whether you get the miraculous answer you desire or not, that you know that God is with you and so are we at St. Peter. My door is always open, whether you need to scream in anger, weep in deep sorrow, or celebrate with great joy.



Hat Ministry



In January, my neighbor showed me the looms that she was using to make hats. There are four different sizes... 5", 7", 9", and 11". I have never knitted before, but thought it looked like fun. I loved making them from the beginning. When people at St. Peter heard about my project through Pastor Stephanie, my care was filled with yarn that next Sunday. I can't tell you how much all that yarn meant to me! Thank you again for making my hat ministry so special. Not very many days go by that I don't add another hat or two to my pile.

So far I have made 441 hats. I have 250 hats that will be sent to Mountain Vision Ministry in Valleyhead, WV around Thanksgiving. First Church of God in Wooster is the local connection. 100 hats are being sent in early October to Forest Hill Elementary School (K-5) in Akron. This elementary school serves students from Nepal, Afghanistan, and other countries. I have already delivered 25 hats to Central American Medical Outreach (CAMO), 15 hats to Pregnancy Care Center, and 10 to Orrville Public Library.

I was contacted by Operation Christmas Child to see if I would be willing to make hats to go in the Christmas shoeboxes. I have made 36 for that project so far. I need to have them turned in by November 1. However many I make will be very much appreciated. I will continue to make them for next Christmas.

I was recently presented with a \$200 Joanns gift card from LORAC to help with the purchase of yarn. I know Mary Kinney passed my name on to them. What a blessing! It is amazing how things have fallen into place so easily. I will continue making hats for as long as I can. It has been a very special project. All the hats are made with love. A special thanks to Pastor Stephanie for blessing many of my hats!

In October we will be studying pumpkins and fire safety. We will be having our annual Halloween costume party.


In November we will center our month around Thanksgiving and how God provides for us and how thankful we are for that.

August 9, 2023 7:00 PM Secretary's Report
